Course description

This course overviews grant writing skills, with a learning-by-doing focus and emphasis on peer review and revision. Students will design and prepare a CFAES Internal Grants Graduate Program application throughout the course, focused on their research project.

Course learning outcomes

By the end of this course, students should successfully demonstrate the written communication skills needed to develop a clear and compelling grant proposal.

HOW THIS ONLINE COURSE WORKS

Mode of delivery: This course is in person. The course is not recorded. I expect you to be present in class.

Pace of activities: This course is divided into **weekly modules**. Students are expected to attend all class sessions and complete homework activities as described in the modules.

Credit hours and work expectations: This is a 2-credit-hour course. According to Ohio State policy (go.osu.edu/credithours), students should expect around 4 hours per week of time spent on direct instruction (instructor content and Carmen activities, for example) in addition to 4 hours of homework (reading and assignment preparation, for example) to receive a grade of (C) average.
